A food bank is a non-profit, charitable organization that gives food to those who have difficulty buying enough food to avoid hunger. Six food banks in Taiwan launched an alliance in Taipei to share their resources and logistics more effectively and to push for lawmaking that encourages donations to food banks. The founding of the Cozy Food Bank Alliance in Taiwan is aimed at "No waste, no hunger."

Members of the alliance will share resources, information and logistics with each other, and cooperate in disaster relief assistance, community development and care services.
