The government in Taiwan has been actively promoting solar panel installations on farmland and fish farms as part of its transition to renewable energy. However, environmental organizations such as Citizen of the Earth, Taiwan, have __1__ about the program's approach. Critics argue that the current strategy has overlooked serious environmental and __2__ consequences for local communities. Large-scale solar projects often result in damaged landscapes, reduced biodiversity, and negative impacts on the livelihoods of local farmers and aquaculturists. __3__, poor communication between officials and affected residents has also become a major issue.

Environmental groups argue that the government's focus should shift

from increasing installation numbers to ensuring quality and sustainability. __4__ current guidelines, solar sites should cover at least 1,000 square meters, which is significantly larger than the 300 square meters recommended by environmental advocates. In fact, experts suggest promoting rooftop solar panels as a more suitable alternative that can minimize environmental impacts. They emphasize that without comprehensive energy policy and stronger public trust, Taiwan's solar energy goals may be difficult to __5__. With no doubt, a more balanced energy transition strategy is needed in Taiwan.

BTS, the famous K-pop group from South Korea, recently finished

their military service. To celebrate their return, their fans—known as ARMY—are supporting a meaningful cause: helping Korean adoptees reconnect with their birth families. From 1955 to 1999, over 140,000 Korean children were adopted by families in other countries. __1__ In some cases, there were problems like false records or adoption without full permission from birth parents. Today, some adoptees are trying to find their birth families, but it can be difficult and expensive. __2__ They are working with KoRoot, a group in Seoul that helps adoptees search for their families and birth documents. Peter Moller from KoRoot said it was very touching that BTS fans, who are not adoptees themselves, care so much about this issue.

__3__ In fact, after some of them were adopted by white families, they were no strangers to racism in their new countries. For these people, seeing Korean stars like BTS in international media helps them feel proud of their Korean heritage. Sometimes, BTS songs even provide comfort and relief. __4__ She said BTS made it easier for her to accept the pain of her adoption experience. __5__ Their fans are using this influence to bring attention to an issue that is still painful for many people.

Independent comic book artists are able to put their work in front of others more quickly than ever before. Artists who have started their comics careers online have gone on to enormous success. The phenomenon of online comics can be seen clearly in South Korea, where they're called "webtoons" and are very popular.

Webtoons are related to South Korea's existing manhwa comics industry, but they have some important differences, influenced by their nature as primarily online media. Webtoons are typically designed to be read in a long visual strip, from top to bottom, instead of being laid out on a page. This reflects the fact that they're meant to be read on a phone, scrolling down with your fingers. Some come out with new strips every day, each one short enough to read in just a few minutes, such as during your commute to work. The short length of the comics has been compared to a small snack, like a bag of chips. South Koreans refer to this as being part of "snack culture."

To find the origins of today's highly competitive comic industry in South Korea, one can look backwards to the year 1979, when some of the country's media censorship laws were relaxed. Before then, people hadn't been free to write and draw what they wanted, as the country was under a strict military regime. When the laws were loosened, the comics industry took off. Once the Internet was invented, and South Korea began adopting it quickly, it was only natural for illustrators to move to working online.

With webtoons, an artist who wants to put their work in front of people doesn't even have to find a publisher who will print off copies. Several websites offer free hosting for webtoons and let the artists make a little money if their work is popular. If enough people visit the website to read their webtoon, the artist can receive a share of the advertising money the

website gets, or charge people to read the comic.
